Mark 14:3-9

The gospel of Mark is considered a crucifixion narrative.

At Bethany at the house of Simon the former-leper. Jesus spent the last days of his life at his home.

A woman with a flask of pure nard. She breaks the flask, she's not protioning it out. She spends it all on Jesus.

There were some who said indignantly.

Indignantly: anger or annoyance at something perceived as unfair. They weren't only mad at what she did but who she was.

They were just saying to themselves but they started scolding her. Jesus is not scolding her. Because of the extravagance of worship. Disciples should take the cue for their response from their Master. The Master did not respond the same way.

Jesus says to leave her alone.

What she has done was beautiful!

Our perception can be different than the Masters.

We can be seeing some things completely different than the Master.

They didn't see the worship differently because they didn't see the woman differently. It was all backwards. They saw her worship as a waste. "It doesn't take all that, or this is stupid, or she don't even mean it anyway."

Worship is not about us, her worship is coming from a place of knowing Jesus is worthy, and it doesn't matter the cost.


You will always have the poor with you, but you will not always have Me.

Talking about selling it and giving to the poor sounds real spiritual.

She knows she needs me more than you think you do.

She has anointed by body for burial. It's not clear if the woman realized what she just did, but Jesus did!





We don't always have to know what God is doing in or through our worship but pleasing God should be all you need.

Be careful not to judge how other people worship God.

Sometimes we come into worship already looking for a reason to be discontent.

Everything we do should be done in worship.

vs.9 "wherever the gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in memory of her."

This part of the story will be shared as a memorial everywhere the gospel is proclaimed. Their sorry attitude and ungodly reaction has been memorialized as well. The argument of who was right or wrong is settled.

Help us not to be found on the wrong side of what God is doing. We need to surrender the attitude to God.

Get before God and ask Him, "why does this bother me?" Surrender your idolatry (perception and attitude) about what God is really doing.

Are you the one in God's way in your life?

You prove this out in decisions, how we choose to think, speak, and act.

He will help you to see and hear clearly.




